

# CAMP RULES

## PENNDLEYOUTH CAMP 2024

1. The daily schedule must be observed by everyone. Attendance at all activities is required. You must adhere to curfew listed on schedule.
2. All vehicles will be parked upon arrival and must remain so until end of Camp.
3. No one is to leave the Conference Center without specific permission from the Network Youth Director, Joe Cali.
4. You have received wristbands. This wristband will serve to identify you as a camper this week and must be worn at all times. You will need this wristband to be served meals in the Dining Hall. You will also need your wristband to be admitted to the Late Night Pool Party. If your wristband breaks, is lost, or otherwise falls off your arm, there is a \$3.00 charge to replace it.
5. No visitors are permitted during the day or after the services. Visitors are ONLY welcome for the Wednesday evening service, but must adhere to all rules, and leave the grounds at the conclusion of the service.
6. The possession or use of tobacco, alcohol, fireworks, or drugs is forbidden and is reason for immediate dismissal from Camp.
7. Skateboards, one-wheels/hoverboards, inline skates, etc. are prohibited.
8. Any sickness or injury must be reported to the Camp Nurse immediately. Students are not permitted to see nurse directly; they must see their leader first and the leader can escort them to the infirmary. All medication must be checked in with the Camp Nurse during registration, and will be administered by the nurse as prescribed by the doctor, or according to normal usage for non-prescription drugs. All before-bed medications must be taken immediately following the evening service, before Late Night activities.
9. No one is to be in the Gym unless it is during the regularly scheduled events or with special permission.
  - During Camp, this building serves as our Sanctuary - it is God's house.
  - No food is permitted in this building.
  - Only water can be drunk in the Gym
  - It must be kept clean / pick up behind you
  - No one is ever to be on the platform without expressed permission.
10. Cell phones can easily be a distraction. We encourage you to use them appropriately and for limited purposes. For example, they are a great tool for Bible reading, note taking and capturing moments here at Camp.

11. You are urged and expected to observe habits of personal and group cleanliness, courtesy, and Christian conduct. (Shower and clean up after yourself. Also, be kind)
12. **CAMP DRESS CODE: *MODESTY IS THE KEY!***  
No skimpy shorts/dresses, crop tops, strapless shirts, or bro tanks. No vulgar or inappropriate messages or images permitted on apparel. Shoes must be worn at all times (even when walking to and from the pool).
13. No guys in girls housing and no girls in guys housing!
14. There are room checks every day. Campers have the responsibility of keeping their dorms clean (Make bed, take out trash, etc.) as part of the privilege of being here.
15. No room changes will be accepted. That includes leaders! For insurance purposes, you must stay in the room that you were assigned to.
16. Don't put anything else down toilets except toilet paper. Do not use irons. Do not lock your room doors at any time. Damage to the Conference Center cannot be tolerated. All damages will be paid for by the offender and will result in dismissal from Camp.
17. Failure to obey any camp rule will subject you to be disciplined by the Network Youth Director with: special job assignments, suspension of privileges, or dismissal from Camp.
18. All chaperones are authorized to maintain order anywhere on the grounds.
